

Mayor Smith then suggested that a website be developed for the City of Jamestown which would allow customers to pay bills on line, find out information about the City, and which could possibly be used as a tool to help attract tourism and industry. He further said he hoped to have a proposal to present at next month's meeting.

On a motion by Danny Hayes, seconded by Ed Brady, the Financial Statement was unanimously approved as read showing the following available funds: General - \$237,535.93, Water - \$672,678.05, Gas - \$2,802,803.65, for a total of \$3,713,017.63.

On a motion by Ed Brady, seconded by Gene Holt, the board voted to pay monthly bills in the amount of \$465,563.12.

Lynn Dayhuff, who lives on Livingston Avenue across the street from the LaFollette Housing Authority apartments, spoke to the board about a problem with a large number of stray cats in the area.

After discussion, Mayor Smith said he would personally talk with the manager of the housing project about the matter if, in fact, the cats were coming from the housing project. He also said he and Bob Lane, City codes enforcer, would check out the area to see if they could locate the source of the stray animals.

With no further business, on a motion by Gene Holt, seconded by Danny Hayes, the board voted to adjourn.
